STEFANO BOCCALINI

b. 1963 in Milan. Italy. Lives and works in Milan

He is professor of Public Art at the Naba in Milan, scientific advisor of the Gianni Colombo Archives, and vice president of Art For The World Europe. He is also part of the board of Careof and was one of the founders of the Isola Art Center in Milan. He works with public institutions and private galleries in Italy and abroad, such as Studio Dabbeni in Lugano which is the artist's reference gallery. From his earliest installations, the relationship with space is the element that characterizes his work. Even if at the beginning, this relationship was physical - and developed in relations with architecture and nature - subsequently it began to transform itself through a more complex of social and anthropological factors. The capitalist nature of current economic processes is at the center of the latest projects: the linguistic turnaround of the economy and its symbolic and social repercussions in financial pervasiveness, is critically revealed by his works.



PAOLO COLOMBO

b. 1949 in Torino, Italy. Lives and works in Athens, Greece.

Paolo Colombo graduated from Colombia University, New York, USA; Yale University, New Haven, USA; and University of Rome, Italy.

In his art practice he employs almost exclusively watercolors and pencils. His work is based on elementary signs: the dot, the line and the small square—the latter as the equivalent of the tessera of a mosaic. Colombo balanced his simple language with a highly technical visual method, making this leap to the visual at a time when mainstream art made little room for lyric expression. Since the 1970s Colombo's work has been in large part based on his poetry; each letter of the text is comprised of thousands of dots, as if gathered from sand or fog from the densely dotted background. The first time this body of work was exhibited was at the Centre d'art contemporain in Geneva in 1978, where he would later go on to serve as the centre's director from 1989-2000.

In his role as a curator, Colombo serves as Art Advisor for the Istanbul Museum of Modern Art (2008 to present). Between 2001 – 2007, Colombo was the curator of the Museo Nazionale delle Arti del XXI Secolo in Rome, and the director of the Centre d'art Contemporain in Geneva between 1989 – 2000.

b. 1987 in Paris, France. He lives and works between Paris and Athens.

The work of Thibaut De Gialluly expresses an incredible appetite, a need to take over the political thing, a profound necessity to understand the sociological patchwork of the extreme left, a bulimic re-reading of history (to the point of removing his moustache to Hitler or to inventing small groups that never existed). He tries to think, to believe, to fight, to refuse populism on all sides, to question the bicycle wheel of Marcel Duchamp who lost his pedals and to ridicule those that Jean Dubuffet called "Sorting agents". The "assemblages" of de Gialluly are composed of drawings, texts, and photographs, as mental territories, cartographies of the history of thought and political action, puzzles of which no piece really corresponds to another; a dramatic vision of the world, with different borders from those we know.

Guðbjörg Lind Jónsdóttir graduated from the Icelandic School of Art and Crafts in 1985. Three years later, she graduated with a teaching license from the same school. Guðbjörg has had 24 solo exhibitions in addition to having participated in numerous group exhibitions in Iceland and abroad. Guðbjörg lives and works in Reykjavík and at Thingeyri. Her works are in the permanent collections of the Reykjavík Art Museum, the Ísafjörður Art Museum, the University of Iceland Art Museum and many other public institutions and private collections. Guðbjörg's paintings find their source inspiration in the environs of her youth, west of the fjords - an attempt to create a world on the boundaries of mind and nature.

ALEKSEY MANUKYAN

b. 1974, St Petersburg, Russia. Lives and works in Gyumri, Armenia

In 2008 Manukyan graduated from Gyumri State Academy of Fine Arts and began work as an art-therapist. Aleksey's interest and continuous desire to develop art in Gyumri inspired him to create and co-found a number of galleries and studios, such as Gyumri "PadVal" gallery and "ArtZone" open-air studio. He is also the co-founder of "5th Floor" creative group. Starting from 2008, Aleksey has taken part in a number of international projects and exhibitions.

In his works, the artist uses different means of expression, realizes installation-performances, land-art, photo and video projects. In 2010, while continuing his interest in social issues, he focused on exploring forgotten or abandoned urban objects, the refuse of urban development, such as monuments, fountains, cemeteries, sheds, old cars, open manholes, underpasses, and street trash. In his eyes, these objects represent the extreme socio-economic poverty of Gyumri; the result of the post-Soviet industrial, post-earthquake and post-war realities. Re-interpreting these symbols through photographic and painting techniques, he infused them with a new identity, communicating the harsh reality of the city of Gyumri as it struggles under the weight of all these traumas.

Augustin Rebetez makes vivacious poetry burst out of simple materials. The contrasts that he stages with pictures, drawings, installations or stop-motion movies depict a tragicomical reality. The results play to the creation of a visually playful, moving, sometimes dizzying or gloomy universe. Since 2009, he has participated to numerous exhibitions, mostly in Europe but also in North America, South Korea, Nigeria, Mexico or Lebanon and was awarded by PhotoFolio Review at the Rencontres d'Arles in France (2010), the Swiss Photo Award (2012), the Kiefer Hablitzel Prize (2012) and the Vevey International Photo Award (2013-2014).

In 2014 he exhibited at the Biennale of Sydney.
In 2015 he did his first creation for the stage at the Théâtre de Vidy in Lausanne.
Since 2011, he has been represented by Nicola Von Senger in Zürich, followed by Feldbuschwiesner in Berlin and Stieglitz19 in Antwerp.
